Subject:- Application dated 30.09.2020 of the Chairman, Guru Hargovind Society, 13 Lajpat Rai Colony, Raisen Road, Bhopal-462023, Madhya Pradesh to start a new Ayurveda Medical College in the name of Sardar Ajit Singh Smriti Ayurved Mahavidyalay, Adampur Chawani, Raisen Road, Distt. Bhopal-462022, Madhya Pradesh with 60 seats (instead of 100 seats) in BAMS course under Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provisions of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government notified that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. In view of the above the Central Government constituted the Autonomous Boards with effect from 11th June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder. Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM ACT 2020 shall not be applicable.

1. I am directed to refer to your application vide dated **30.09.2020** forwarded by GOI vide letter No. **L.14012/34/2020-EP (1) dated 22.10.2020**, on the subject cited above and to verify the physical and other infrastructure facilities available at proposed Ayurved College **Sardar Ajit Singh Smriti Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Adampur Chawani, Raisen Road, Distt. Bhopal-462022, Madhya Pradesh (AYU0631)**, the college was visited on **14.09.2021** for LOI by the visitation team of the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) and as per direction of competent authority Letter of Intent has been issued to you vide letter No. **3-3-5/2021-Ay(57) dated 07.10.2021** to establish a new Ayurveda college in the name of "**Sardar Ajit Singh Smriti Ayurved Mahavidyalay, Adampur Chawani, Raisen Road, Distt. Bhopal-462022, Madhya Pradesh (AYU0631)**" with **100 seats in UG (BAMS) course** from the academic session 2021-22 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.
2. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) had carried out an inspection of the institution again on **24.11.2021** for Letter of Permission (LOP) and to assess the available facilities of teaching and practical training for conducting UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.
3. The college has been assessed on the basis of concerned regulations and relaxation policy issued by the Ministry of Ayush. On examining, the college was not fulfilling the criteria for issuing Letter of Permission for 100 seats. In view of that, to follow the principle of natural justice as mentioned in the Constitution of India an opportunity of hearing was granted to your college on **21.01.2022** to present the case through virtual mode.
4. On examining the hearing committee report and submission of the college it is found that the College is not fulfilling the notified and approved criteria for Issuing Letter of Permission (LOP) for 100 seats

in UG (BAMS) course, however college is fulfilling the notified and approved criteria for 60 seats in UG BAMS Course for the Academic Session 2021-22.

5. Therefore, on the basis of request of the college for reducing the seat vide ref. no. **SGHS/AYUR/22/03** dated **03.02.2022** & by conferring the power rendered with section 28 (f) of NCISM Act, 2020, it has been decided by the **President, National Commission for Indian System of Medicine to issue Letter of Permission to the Chairman, Guru Hargovind Society, 13 Lajpat Rai Colony, Raisen Road, Bhopal-462023, Madhya Pradesh to start a new Ayurveda Medical College in the name of Sardar Ajit Singh Smriti Ayurved Mahavidyalay, Adampur Chawani, Raisen Road, Distt. Bhopal-462022, Madhya Pradesh with 60 seats (instead of 100 seats) in BAMS course for the academic session 2021-22** subject to the following conditions:-
 - i. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month from the date of issue of the letter, explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying fee same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provident Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
 - ii. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 60 UG (BAMS) seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2021-22 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
6. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
7. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
8. The requirements as mentioned in following regulations should be fulfilled by the college for getting permission for **100 seats in UG BAMS course** for the academic session 2022-23 before applying for the session 2022-23 (before opening of part-1 visitation proforma):
 - (i) all the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
 - (ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
 - (iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in to.
9. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college before the opening of Part-I visitation Proforma for the next academic year to get permission for the session 2022-23:
 - (i) all the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
 - (ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
 - (iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto;
10. The college administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the NCISM ACT and relevant regulations thereunder, are in position before the admission of the first batch of students in the 1st professional of BAMS course is made, under intimation to the Medical Assessment and rating Board, NCISM.
11. The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for II, III and IV professionals well in time as per the erstwhile CCIM norms which will be verified by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM and accordingly, the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be issued.
12. The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 35 of the NCISM Act, 2020 at that time when the first, batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.

13. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission matter from the academic session 2022-23.
14. Further vide commission letter ref no. **3-5/2021-Ay (57)** dated **08.02.2022** letter has been sent to the college to furnish fixed security deposit worth rupees **02 Crore** in favour of National Commission fund for Indian system of Medicine, in response of the same college has furnished the fixed security deposit in favour of **The National Commission fund for Indian System of Medicine through transaction UTR No.- UTIBR52022021000358813 dated 10.02.2022 of 02 Crore transferred by Axis Bank, Branch- Indrapuri Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh for a period of five years.**
